BAKED PARMESAN ZUCCHINI

YIELD: 4 SERVINGS PREP TIME: 10 MINUTES COOK TIME: 20 MINUTES TOTAL TIME: 30 MINUTES Crisp, tender zucchini sticks oven-roasted to perfection. It's healthy, nutritious and completely addictive!

INGREDIENTS:

4 zucchini, quartered lengthwise 1/2 cup freshly grated Parmesan

1/2 teaspoon dried thyme
1/2 teaspoon dried oregano
1/2 teaspoon dried basil
1/4 teaspoon garlic powder

Kosher salt and freshly ground black pepper, to taste

2 tablespoon chopped fresh parsley leaves 2 tablespoons olive oil

DIRECTIONS:

Preheat oven to 350 degrees F. Coat a cooling rack with nonstick spray and place on a baking sheet; set aside.

In a small bowl, combine Parmesan, thyme, oregano, basil, garlic powder, salt and pepper, to taste. Place zucchini onto prepared baking sheet. Drizzle with olive oil and sprinkle with Parmesan mixture. Place into oven and bake until tender, about 15 minutes. Then broil for 2-3 minutes, or until crisp and golden brown.

Serve immediately, garnished with parsley, if desired.

Slow-Cooker Caramel Corn

1/2 cup butter, cut into tablespoons 1 cup packed light brown sugar

1/4 cup light corn syrup 1 teaspoon baking soda

1 teaspoon vanilla 12 cups plain popped popcorn

2 cups mini pretzel twists 1 cup mixed nuts

Steps

Spray 6-quart slow cooker with cooking spray.

In bottom of slow cooker, layer butter, brown sugar and corn syrup. Cover and cook on High heat setting 30 minutes. Carefully remove slow cooker's ceramic insert, leaving cover on, and rotate 180 degrees. Continue to cook on High heat setting another 30 minutes or until caramel mixture is bubbling vigorously around edges.

Remove cover; turn heat setting to Low. Stir in baking soda and vanilla until well blended; mixture will foam while being stirred. Add popcorn; stir well to coat popcorn, making sure to reach bottom and all around inside of slow cooker. Continue to cook, uncovered, on Low heat setting 1 hour to 1 hour 30 minutes, stirring every 15 to 20 minutes, until popcorn looks dry and caramel is cooked on. Spread on waxed paper. Cool 15 minutes. Stir in pretzel twists and nuts. Store at room temperature in airtight container.

ED EWALT – A little history about Dinner at Six



Ginger and I joined the church shortly after moving to Oroville in 1987. Our then Pastor, Karen McClintock, visited us in our home and brought a copy of the *Golden Feather* with her. She was explaining the various activities of the Church and mentioned that they had just lost the cook for this wonderful new program called Dinner at Six.

Sally Casner was the original cook but had to leave due to a new full-time job. At that time there were around 15 diners and the clean-up was done by volunteers. I mentioned that I did a lot of cooking at home and for guests and maybe I could do it. Karen was so surprised, she practically jumped off the couch.

I started cooking Sept. 1987 and did all the shopping and cooking. Ginger helped pull it all together at the end. Marguerite and Howard Standefer were our original table setters. Genevieve Heath helped at the start too.

There were about 300 people in the congregation then. The attendance for the dinners stayed about the same the first year, then began to increase until we were feeding about 40 people for several years. We kept the price at \$2.00 until 1990, then \$2.50 for a couple of years, then \$4.00 from about 1998 until this year, \$5.00.

Ted Grainger came on the scene about 4 years ago by encouraging me to buy warming and serving equipment, much of which he donated. He greatly improved presentation.

As time went by, I kept expanding the menu. Attendance increased during the last 4 or 5 years to an average of about 60 to 70 in 2000-2002.

Ted and I were beginning to do many food fund-raisers. Mother's day brunches, special brunches and dinners. Desserts were prepared in the earlier days by Edith Davis, then for many years by Joan (Wayes) Smith with frequent contributions by Jolene, Genevieve and some others.

When Ginger and I were out of town, dinners were prepared at first by Jim Webster. During the last 3 years Ted and Vivian Grainger prepared them.

Dorothy Wise was the "Shepherd" of Dinner at Six right from the beginning. She always made the announcements, collected the money and kept statistics so that we knew where we were and how we were contributing to the budget. In 1993 we began hiring dishwashers and Dorothy made sure they were always scheduled.

It should be mentioned that the program was not meant to be a revenue producing activity but evolved as such quite substantially.

Some of our later frequent helpers were Elaine Klein, John Voos and many others who would just drop by and help whenever needed. I feel privileged to have been able to do dinner at six for 16 years. I benefited greatly from the experience. The congregation was always totally supporting and complimentary beyond my expectations. - ED

A funny Story: I was preparing vanilla pudding. I made a "simulated" double boiler by placing a round bottom pan inside of a larger pan. The pans formed a tight seal and suddenly it blew up with a terrific bang and hurled pudding all over the kitchen and the inside pot just barely missed me as It went ballistic across the kitchen. What a cleaning job!

Veterans Memorial Park opens in Oroville

Oroville >> A dream nearly two decades in the making met a major milestone Friday as about 100 people came to admire the newly constructed granite tile wall at the Oroville Veterans Memorial Park For All of Butte County. The park, at 2374 Montgomery St., is now open to the public. Its groundbreaking was celebrated last May.

The tiles on the 10-foot-tall Wall of Honor display the veterans' names, branch of military and the war in which they served. Above the names reads: "Service, Courage, Bravery and Valor." Those with loved ones who served with ties to Butte County had the opportunity to buy one of

the nearly 900 memorial tiles.

Mary Robinson, who was raised in Oroville, had several installed on the wall for her father, brother, brother-in-law and husband.

"I think it's wonderful and really something to know veterans appreciate their soldiers," Robinson said. The park was largely the brainchild of <u>Stu Shaner</u>, <u>who died last year</u> at age 76. Shaner was a veterans advocate and co-chair of the Oroville Veterans Memorial Park Committee for over a decade. He grew up in Oroville and wrote historical columns for the Oroville Mercury-Register.

During the ceremony, Jeff Shaner decided to give a tribute to his dad by repeating some of his formerly written words.

"I can tell you Stu Shaner is looking down with a big smile on his face, thankful that we are here today and would like to remind you that we still have a long way to go and still need a lot more donations if we are going to make this park the youth field trip destination it deserves to become," Shaner said. Don Noble, chair of the Supplemental Benefits Fund from the Lake Oroville project, recalled seeing a high school friend for the last time as he headed off to the Vietnam War, to never see him again. He thanked those who made sure veterans would not be forgotten.

The committee turned a piece of "nondescript" land into "sacred ground," Noble said.

"Thank you for never giving up," he said. "Thank you for doing this for all the right reasons." Bill Connelly, co-chair of the Oroville Veterans Memorial Park Committee, said the park was meant as more of a place for reflection than for picnics. Connelly is also the chair of the Butte County Board of Supervisors.


It took 17 years of planning to get to this point, he said. The committee lost 27 of its original volunteers over that time span.

"We all know he'd be really proud of what it is now and what it's going to be," Connelly said of his late friend, Stu Shaner.


Connelly said six more memorial additions are planned for the site, including a 7-foot bronze statue of a bugler in World War II attire, a flag and more walkways. The committee is seeking donations.

"Nothing done here will be anything but first class," Connelly said.

There will be a dedication ceremony at the park on Aug. 12 at 9:30 a.m. *Reach reporter Risa Johnson at 896-7763*.




Message from Joan Partington Mayle
