UPDATE ON HOW OUR SHARE CARDS ARE DOING AS A FUNDRAISER FOR OUR CHURCH BUDGET

Our share cards at Food Maxx and Raley's are a good fundraiser for our church general fund. In January 2017 our Food Maxx share cards made \$119.31 and in February 2017 \$62.28. Year to date they have made \$181.59.Our Raley's Something Extra Cards made \$72.88 in January 2017. We receive money from Food Maxx every month and from Raley's once every three months.

There is no card at Food Maxx any longer. As soon as the clerk starts to scan your groceries just put the church phone number (530) 534-9455 in the key pad and touch the green button. If you have any problem ask the clerk to help you. When you get your receipt from the clerk you will see how much went to the scrip which is our Food Maxx Share Cards. At Raley's there is still a Something Extra Card. Just scan your card. If you don't have a card ask for a card the next time you shop at Raley's. With the Raley's card you are required to designate how much you want to come back to our church. You can do this on your own computer at home. If you don't have a computer or if you have trouble setting this up ask Jeremy Buis to help. Jeremy will be glad to help you.

Put the Food Maxx and Raley's cards together and we have made \$254.47 so far this year. Please keep using your share cards when you go shopping for groceries. What an easy way to help your church budget.

ED EWALT – A little history about Dinner at Six



Ginger and I joined the church shortly after moving to Oroville in 1987. Our then Pastor, Karen McClintock, visited us in our home and brought a copy of the *Golden Feather* with her. She was explaining the various activities of the Church and mentioned that they had just lost the cook for this wonderful new program called Dinner at Six.

Sally Casner was the original cook but had to leave due to a new full-time job. At that time there were around 15 diners and the clean-up was done by volunteers. I mentioned that I did a lot of cooking at home and for guests and maybe I could do it. Karen was so surprised, she practically jumped off the couch.

I started cooking Sept. 1987 and did all the shopping and cooking. Ginger helped pull it all together at the end. Marguerite and Howard Standefer were our original table setters. Genevieve Heath helped at the start too.

There were about 300 people in the congregation then. The attendance for the dinners stayed about the same the first year, then began to increase until we were feeding about 40 people for several years. We kept the price at \$2.00 until 1990, then \$2.50 for a couple of years, then \$4.00 from about 1998 until this year, \$5.00.

Ted Grainger came on the scene about 4 years ago by encouraging me to buy warming and serving equipment, much of which he donated. He greatly improved presentation.

As time went by, I kept expanding the menu. Attendance increased during the last 4 or 5 years to an average of about 60 to 70 in 2000-2002.

Ted and I were beginning to do many food fund-raisers. Mother's day brunches, special brunches and dinners. Desserts were prepared in the earlier days by Edith Davis, then for many years by Joan (Wayes) Smith with frequent contributions by Jolene, Genevieve and some others.

When Ginger and I were out of town, dinners were prepared at first by Jim Webster. During the last 3 years Ted and Vivian Grainger prepared them.

Dorothy Wise was the "Shepherd" of Dinner at Six right from the beginning. She always made the announcements, collected the money and kept statistics so that we knew where we were and how we were contributing to the budget. In 1993 we began hiring dishwashers and Dorothy made sure they were always scheduled.

It should be mentioned that the program was not meant to be a revenue producing activity but evolved as such quite substantially.

Some of our later frequent helpers were Elaine Klein, John Voos and many others who would just drop by and help whenever needed. I feel privileged to have been able to do dinner at six for 16 years. I benefited greatly from the experience. The congregation was always totally supporting and complimentary beyond my expectations. - ED

A funny Story: I was preparing vanilla pudding. I made a "simulated" double boiler by placing a round bottom pan inside of a larger pan. The pans formed a tight seal and suddenly it blew up with a terrific bang and hurled pudding all over the kitchen and the inside pot just barely missed me as It went ballistic across the kitchen. What a cleaning job!

Chocolate-Peanut Butter Bombes

3 cups chocolate chips 2 sticks (8 ounces) butter, 5 tablespoons melted

1/4 cup peanut butter 5 large egg yolks, at room temperature

1/4 cup sugar 2 cups heavy cream 2 cups broken graham crackers (about 20 squares) 1/3 cup corn syrup

1/2 cup roasted, salted peanuts, plus chopped peanuts for garnish

Line six 6-ounce custard cups with plastic wrap. In a saucepan over low heat, melt 1 2/3 cups chocolate chips, 5 tablespoons butter and the peanut butter; stir to combine.

In a double boiler, whisk the egg yolks until frothy. Whisk in 2 tablespoons sugar over medium-low heat until doubled in volume, about 10 minutes. Let cool.

Beat the cream with the remaining 2 tablespoons sugar until soft peaks form. Fold the peanut butter mixture into the egg yolk mixture, then fold in the whipped cream. Divide among the prepared custard cups; tap lightly to settle. Cover with plastic wrap; refrigerate for 4 hours.

In a food processor, grind the graham crackers and 1/2 cup peanuts and then pulse in the 5 tablespoons melted butter.

Unwrap the custard cups, divide the graham cracker mixture among the cups and press to set. Refrigerate for 15 minutes more.

Combine the remaining 1 1/3 cups chocolate chips, 6 tablespoons butter and corn syrup. Microwave at high power until melted, about 30 seconds; stir to combine.

Invert the custard cups onto plates; discard the plastic wrap. Drizzle with the chocolate glaze and sprinkle with the chopped peanuts; refrigerate for 15 minutes.

1 cup cherry or grape tomatoes, quartered 4 ounces fresh mozzarella cheese, cubed 1 cup coarsely chopped cucumber 3/4 cup mixed spring salad greens 2 tablespoons chopped green onion (1)

1 tablespoon red wine vinegar or cider vinegar 1 tablespoon olive oil

1/4 teaspoon salt 1/8 teaspoon ground black pepper

4 large whole wheat pita bread rounds, halved crosswise

Large soft lettuce leaves (such as butterhead, Boston, or bibb)

Directions

In a medium bowl toss together tomatoes, cheese cubes, cucumber, salad greens, basil, green onion, vinegar, oil, salt, and pepper.

Line insides of pita halves with lettuce leaves. Spoon tomato mixture into pitas. If desired, wrap each pita in plastic wrap and chill for up to 2 hours before serving.
