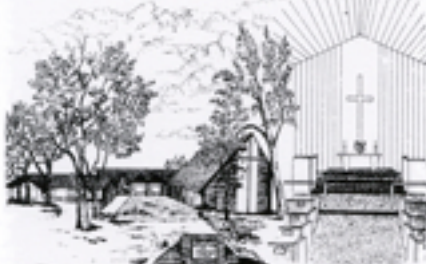

UPDATE ON HOW OUR SHARE CARDS ARE DOING AS A FUNDRAISER FOR OUR CHURCH BUDGET

I want to give you an update on how our Food Maxx Share Cards are doing as a fundraiser for our church general fund. We receive an automatic bank deposit from Food Maxx each month. In September 2017 we received \$64.59 Year to date \$715.12. Remember to put in the church phone number when you pay for your groceries at Food Maxx. When the clerk starts to scan your groceries put in the church phone number (530) 534-9455 and touch the green button. The amount you spend will appear on your grocery receipt. It will show how much you have spent in the current month. Money will come back to the church general fund. There is no card to use any longer. If you have any problem ask the clerk to help you. Once in awhile the place you put in the church phone number will not come up and you need to ask the clerk to help you. Most of the time it works just fine. What an easy way to help our church general fund.

Keep helping the church general fund when you purchase your groceries at Food Maxx.

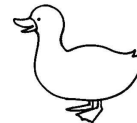
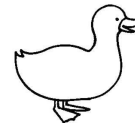
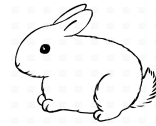
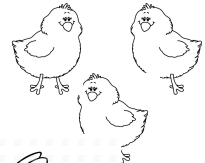
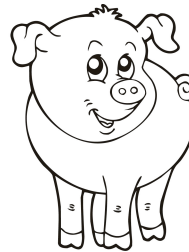
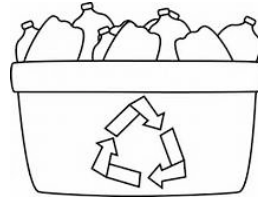
If you know a family with a 3 year old child or older please let them know of our State PreSchool at the church.

This year the legislature has finally raised the income limit to allow more families and children the opportunity of learning in our PreSchool program. Last year our Director, April Boling, was unable to allow many families entrance into the program because the minimum wage had been raised but the income level for the classes had not been set higher. This summer, the State Legislator finally realized that they needed to make adjustments to the income entry qualifications. With this change we are hoping that both morning and afternoon classes will be full. The class enrollment sets the amount of money that the church receives each month. It is a wonderful program and our director, April Boling, does an excellent job in preparing the children for kindergarten.

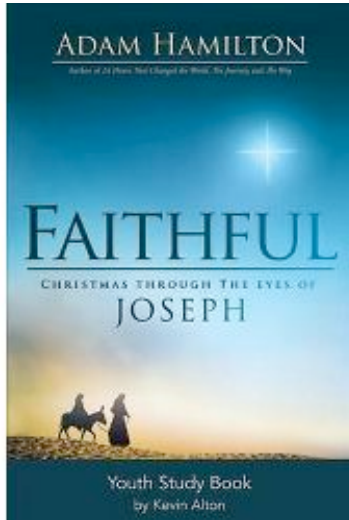

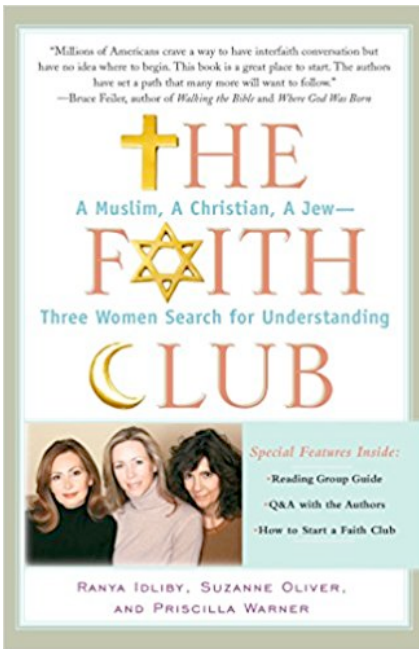


Preparing for Christmas

His first assignment was at Keesler AFB in Biloxi, Mississippi. From there he went to Offutt AFB in Omaha, Nebraska. While in Omaha he graduated with his Bachelor's Degree. In 1994 he spent a year at Kunsan AFB in South Korea. He came back to Offutt the next year and then was stationed at Eglin AFB in Florida. Timothy's last assignment was at Bagram AFB in Afghanistan. Timothy retired from the Air Force after 20 years. His retirement coincided with Katrina sweeping through Florida. His trip home to California was very slow as gas was very hard to come by after Katrina's disastrous landfall. Timothy now resides in San Antonio where he originally started in the Air Force.

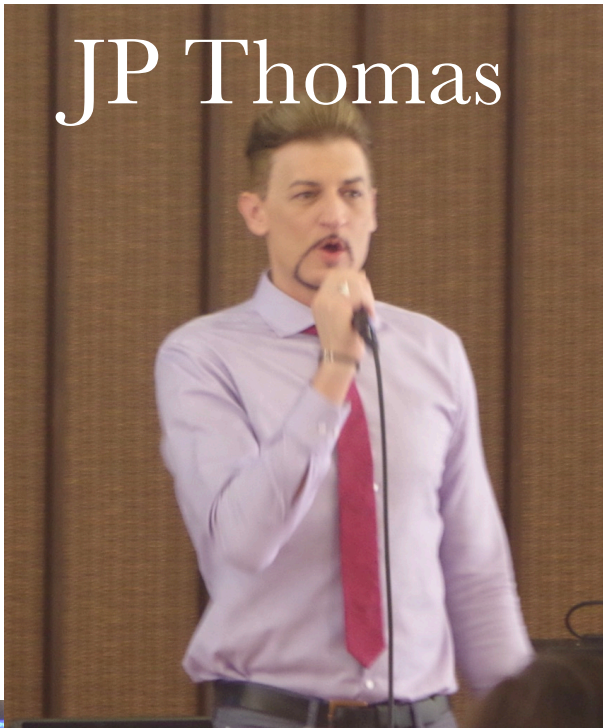
