

Dr. Bob Biehler and I will remain in the Oroville First United Methodist Church. It's a time of change in our church as well as a time of change for the Marysville Methodist Hmong Church. Yet, in this change, I believe that God has a plan and He will use this to the benefit of both churches and to the benefit of the greater Methodist Church.

Here in this article, I would like to write a little bit about Pastor Chuckua and his influence on me. When I came into the FUMC in September of 2013, he was my first Methodist pastor. In him, I saw a very humble man who has a great desire to see his church grow and to be active in serving God. 

UPDATE ON HOW OUR SHARE CARDS ARE DOING AS A FUNDRAISER FOR OUR CHURCH BUDGET

Our share cards at Food Maxx and Raley's are a good fundraiser for our church general fund. In January 2017 our Food Maxx share cards made \$119.31 and in February 2017 \$62.28. Year to date they have made \$181.59. Our Raley's Something Extra Cards made \$72.88 in January 2017. We receive money from Food Maxx every month and from Raley's once every three months.

There is no card at Food Maxx any longer. As soon as the clerk starts to scan your groceries just put the church phone number (530) 534-9455 in the key pad and touch the green button. If you have any problem ask the clerk to help you. When you get your receipt from the clerk you will see how much went to the scrip which is our Food Maxx Share Cards. At Raley's there is still a Something Extra Card. Just scan your card. If you don't have a card ask for a card the next time you shop at Raley's. With the Raley's card you are required to designate how much you want to come back to our church. You can do this on your own computer at home. If you don't have a computer or if you have trouble setting this up ask Jeremy Buis to help. Jeremy will be glad to help you.

Put the Food Maxx and Raley's cards together and we have made \$254.47 so far this year. Please keep using your share cards when you go shopping for groceries. What an easy way to help your church budget.



FRESH PINEAPPLE CABBAGE SLAW

1 ½	C	finely shredded or chopped cabbage (the greener the cabbage, the more nutritious)
½	C	raisins
¼	C	flaked coconut
½	C	finely diced celery
1	C	fresh pineapple, cut into ½" cubes, drained (sic.)

DRESSING

¼	C	plain yogurt
¼	C	mayonnaise
¼	tsp	seasoned salt
¼	tsp	Dijon-style mustard
		paprika
		celery leaves for garnish

Place cabbage into bowl. Set aside. Soak raisins in hot water for 5 minutes. Drain and add to cabbage. Stir in coconut, celery and pineapple and lightly mix together. Set aside.

Combine dressing ingredients and mix well. Fold dressing into the cabbage mixture and mix until well combined. Chill 1 hour or longer to blend flavors. Before serving, sprinkle lightly with paprika. Garnish with celery leaves and serve. Serves 4.

1	pkg	frozen raspberries
¾	C	sugar
½	C	water
3	Tbsp	cornstarch
2		egg whites, beaten stiff
		whipped cream of Cool Whip for topping

Place raspberries, sugar and ¼ C water in pan. Bring to a boil. Mix cornstarch with ¼ C water and stir into raspberry mixture to thicken. Cook for a few minutes. Set aside to cool. Fold stiffly beaten egg whites and about 1 C of Cool Whip into the cooled raspberry mixture. Ladle into dessert dish and refrigerate until set. Garnish with Cool Whip just before serving.
