





Douglass Krause (1922 - 2019)

DOUGLASS KRAUSE Douglass O.
Krause went to be with the Lord on
Saturday, February 9, 2019. Doug was born
December 14, 1922 to Otto and Freda Krause
in Dayton, Ohio. He was a resident of Oroville
for 70 years. Mr. Krause along with his twin
brother, Howard, enlisted in the U.S. Army
Infantry at an early age. They both volunteered into

the U.S. Air Corps. Howard trained as a radio operator gunner and Douglass trained as a ball turret gunner. They both completed their combat tours in the ETO flying out of England. Mr. Krause went on to serve with the 1st Allied Airborne Division (Gliders) participated in operations: Overlord, Market-Garden, the Bulge and the final drop across the Rhine and earning five battle stars along with other decorations. During World War II he met and married his wife of 53 years, Marjorie (she passed away in 1997). Upon completing his service in 1948 he settled in Oroville and was emp-loyed in the plumbing, sheet metal and lumber trades. He worked for Thode Lumber for many years and last worked for Better Deal Exchange. He was a life member of the DAV, VFW and 71 year member of the Oroville Masonic Lodge No. 103 where he served as their secretary for many years. He was also a member of Franklin Chapter No. 20, Royal Arch Masons, Past Patron of Amapola Chapter 119 and Order of the Eastern Star. He was a 50 year member of the Wyan-dotte Grange. He enjoyed gardening and fishing. He is survived by his three children: Mary Ann Bainbridge-Krause, Michael Krause and Joel Krause; his three grand-children: Shane Krause, Stephanie Basinger and Heather Krause; and three great grandchildren. February was a very good month for our church finances. All of our bills that were due were paid on time. As I told you last month Food Maxx is no longer supporting the shares cards and that fundraiser ended at the end of February. Our Dinner @ Six has been hurt by the bad weather on Wednesday evenings but the dinner did much better in February. The Hmong Ministry had a fundraiser for Valentine's Day with the PHO Soup lunch. This was a fundraiser for The Hmong Ministry. The proceeds were deposited in The Hmong Ministry Fund. At the same time The Youth sold tea at The PHO Soup lunch. This was a fundraiser for the youth. The proceeds was deposited in the Youth Fund. On February 3rdThe Outreach Committee put on a soup luncheon to raise money for The Oroville Hunger Walk. The proceeds of \$327.00 raised has been sent to The CCCO that sponsors The Oroville Hunger Walk.

Thanks for your help with our church finances. Thank you John S. Fowler Church Treasurer To All those who Make the First United Methodist Church their Home:

Those of you that don't know what has happened this last week, we received a notice from April Boling the Preschool Director advising us of a State Inspection for the preschool on the week of March 18-22. She requested our help especially in cleaning of the kitchen. It was discussed at the General Church Council meeting on March 3rd. Alma Short volunteered to meet with April where she compiled a list of the things that needed to be done in the kitchen for the inspection. This list was then made into a work schedule so that people could sign up to help with any duties they felt they could do. The majority of the work took place from Wednesday, March 13th to Saturday, March 16, 2019.

Wednesday Alma and Janet Short cleaned out and scrubbed the utensils drawers and the pot cupboards and then organized them, removing unneeded pots. Derek Cheek removed unneeded utensils from the utensils drawers.

Susan Sharon and Liz Holdaway tackled the major task of cleaning out the custodial room behind the kitchen removing extra supplies, tools, and moving them to the equipment shed by the play area. They also helped clean the floor areas and baseboards around cupboards and walls. Liz did the major work cleaning the metal and plastic food carts.

April Boling sprayed the oven racks, crumb trays, and inside of the stove with oven cleaner on Thursday. I was also aware that April did a lot of cleaning in the kitchen while trying to get the rest of the school ready for the survey.

Then Kham and Maiv Vang took charge of cleaning the stove: cleaning the oven, crumb trays, oven racks, the area beneath the trays, the burners and burner grates (scrubbing them and running them through the dishwasher), and the outside of the stove. The inside and outside of the stove hood, the oven racks, the steel grease filters, and the fire suppressant wands were also cleaned.

The men from Jordon's Crossing also came on Thursday and mowed and weed-eated the large lawn area out front as well as the smaller lawn area in front of the church, the Risdon court, and the preschool courtyard.

Brittany, Savannah, Maria, Linda, Donna, and Jennifer, the young women from Jordon's Crossing were a major work force on Friday, doing a lot of the tough duties. They cleaned the cupboard surfaces, floors and baseboards around the cupboards, and under the sinks and dishwasher with wire brushes, polishing the garbage disposal, cleaning the water and drain pipes, and cleaning the walls. Following that they cleaned the counters and sinks. Then they finished by cleaning the mats that go on the floor beside the dishwasher and back sink.

Derek Cheek came in on Saturday and tried to repair the motor running the fan to the stove hood. After some repairs and adjustments he realized he needed to replace the motor. With the help of Jim Webster and Susan Sharon who figured out how to purchase the motor, and Bill Cheek purchasing it, he replaced the motor and adjusted the bracket and drive belt so that it worked perfectly.

Last but not least Susan Sharon was the one person who was able to coordinate the men and women from Jordon's Crossing, open the church for those who needed access, got the cleaning supplies, tools, and other things that were needed to get things done. She was always there when we needed her.

The other major effort for completion and passing the survey was the repair of the southwest play yard fence. April Boling, Janet Short, and Nonie Buis provided a wonderful lunch, snacks, and drinks for the work party. It took from 8:30 AM to 1 PM to replace the fence and retaining boards, and from about 1 PM to 3 PM to finish eating. Pastor Chang and Shoua also volunteered to bring food and drinks, but agreed to bring them instead for the April 13 workday since we had so many volunteering already.

Derek Cheek headed up the work party and directed the whole operation. Susan Sharon was the first one there getting out the church tools needed for the job. Micah Buis was a close 2nd and started tearing down the fence. Wayne Smith and Lawrence were also part of the church crew. Susan also recruited 4 men from Jordan's crossing which turned out to be 6 men: John, James, Anthony, Andy, Dana, and JW(James). Kham Vang had recruited 5-6 men from the Hmong congregation, but since we had so many people already they were asked to wait and provide manpower for the April 13 workday.

The old fence was taken down first, along with the one retaining board. Then the dirt was removed away from the posts of the fence. 3 retaining boards were cut and fitted as the new retaining border and the posts were predrilled. Then they were removed so the new wire could be replaced. The 50 feet of new wire was not quite enough so about 7 feet of the old wire was spliced into the new wire and cut and shaped to the right height. While the wire was being spliced another group was attaching the bottom guide wire to the fence.

Then the whole piece of fence wire was lifted by the 10 workers and walked into place along the fence rail and posts. Then it was temporarily held in place by zip ties and connected to the fence post at one end with a splice rod, brackets, and bolts then stretched with a come-along winch. With the fence wire in place it was secured to the bottom guide wire with hog clips, and to the rail and posts permanently with wire ties. The splicing rod on the other end was attached with brackets and bolts and the excess wire was removed by cutting a splice of the fence wire. Then the sand was replaced to the proper grade to the wire and retaining boards and smoothed neatly. When the job was complete the unwanted materials were discarded and the tools replaced. Then everyone hit the chow line. It was a great day.

The Board of Trustees for the church want to thank everyone for their major efforts and dedication in completing these important projects needed for the preschool to pass their state inspection. No one can be given the amount of credit due for all their efforts in this report. Suffice it to say that despite the happy and joyful atmosphere during these projects that everyone did their jobs above and beyond the call of duty. Thank you again.
