

BOARD OF TRUSTEES ANNOUNCEMENT ON REPAIRS

Over the past 7 months, the trustees have had a number of major projects including repair of the roof, repair of a portion of the playground fence, a thorough cleaning of the kitchen for state inspection, replacement/repair of the main waterline, removal of a number of dead, dangerous, and undesirable trees, as well as mowing, weed removal, and other maintenance of the outside grounds.

Thankfully, we have had tremendous help from the people of Jordan's Crossing on all these projects.

With all these major projects a number of simpler repairs and maintenance have gotten overlooked.

The Board of Trustees has developed a list of needed repairs, some of which need little technical skill, just someone with the time to do them. We have prioritized the list and given a skill level needed to accomplish them. Please see the list of needed repairs with the priority and skill levels defined.


