#### SPINACH-STUFFED ZUCCHINI Joline Hibbert

3 6" to 8" zucchinis

pkg frozen chopped spinach

4 slices bacon

1

2 green onions, sliced

1½ Tbsp flour

½ C ½ & ½ or milk

½ C shredded sharp cheese

Cook whole zucchinis in boiling water until tender (about 7 minutes); drain. Cook spinach as directed on package and drain well. Cook bacon until crisp; drain and crumble, reserving drippings.

Add onions to bacon dripping and sauté 2 minutes. Stir in flour. Gradually stir in milk. Stir until thick. Remove from heat and stir in spinach and  $\frac{1}{4}$  C cheese. Cut zucchini in halves lengthwise and scoop out center seeds. Drain; place in shallow pan and fill with spinach mixture. Sprinkle with salt, cheese and bacon. Bake at  $350\infty$  for 20 minutes.

### VIVIAN'S LITE BROCCOLI AL FORNO Vivian Grainger

Broccoli

1 pkg 96% low-fat ham slices

1 pkg veggie slices, organic tofu Pepper Jack cheese alternative

Italian seasoning

The "cheese" can be found at Galaxy Foods or other grocery stores next to the regular cheese. Cook broccoli until just tender. Spray non-stick coating onto a baking dish. Sprinkle Italian Seasoning on surface. Add a layer of broccoli, then a layer of ham, and lastly the "cheese" slices. Put in hot oven or under broiler until cheese melts.

### **BROCCOLI CASSEROLE Genevieve Heath**

1 bunch broccoli

2 Tbsp finely chopped onion

bread or cracker crumbs cream of mushroom soup

1 can cream of mushroom

2 eggs

1 C mayonnaise

cheese, grated


Cook broccoli until tender; drain and place in a buttered baking dish with onion. Layer or top with bread crumbs. Mix soup, eggs and mayonnaise together and pour over broccoli. Bake until bubbly hot. Top with grated cheese and return to oven to melt 10 minutes more. Spinach can be substituted for broccoli.



Many good years and memories of my church.


