2 scant Tbsp prepared horseradish (optional)

Mix lime and lemon Jell-o with hot water. Mix pineapple, cottage cheese and mayonnaise together and add to Jell-o mixture. Add nuts and, if desired, horseradish. Chill until firm.

1	C	milk

Dissolve Jell-o in boiling water. Add orange juice concentrate. Add drained fruits. (Other fruits may be substituted.) Make topping by mixing instant pudding and milk. When thick, fold in Cool Whip. Spread over firm Jell-o. This also makes a delicious dessert.

Many good years and memories of my church.






