FIRST UNITED METHODIST CHURCH OF OROVILLE CHURCH SHARE CARDS

I want to give you an update on how our church share cards are doing as a fundraiser for our church and I need to tell you about a change to the Raley's card.

In 2012 the Food Maxx share card made a profit of \$812.37 and the Raley's card made \$350.92 for our church treasury. So far in 2013 the Food Maxx share card has made a profit of \$199.61 and the Raley's card has made a profit of \$156.01. This helps our church treasury very much.



There has been no change to the Food Maxx share card. Every time you pay for your groceries give your card to the clerk and the clerk will scan your card and our church will get back some money from your purchase. This will help our church treasury. If you don't have a card see Ginger Ewalt about getting a card.

There has been a change to the Raley's card.

What we called the share card was actually the Quality of Life card. The Quality of Life card ended on December 31, 2012 and has been replaced by the new Something Extra card. If you haven't done so you need to sign up for the new card in the store at Raley's or you can use your own computer and sign up for the card on line. Just type in Raley's Something Extra card. Enroll in Something Extra Rewards Program and then you can designate

what percent you want to come back to the church. If you have the new card but didn't designate what percent you want to come back to the church you will have to go on line to designate what percent you want to come back to the church. If you prefer come into the church office on a Wednesday when Elaine Klein is working in the office and she will do it for you. So see Elaine.

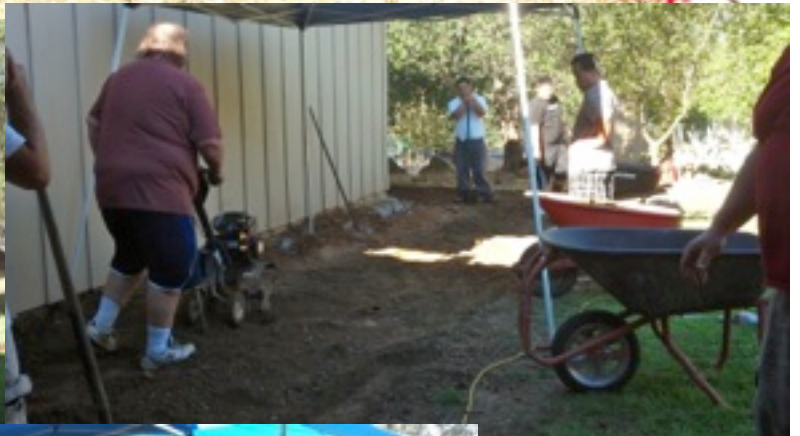

PERSIMMON PUDDING #2

FIRST UNITED METHODIST CHURCH OF OROVILLE

- 1 C sugar
- 2 Tbsp shortening
- 1 C persimmon pulp
- 2 tsp baking soda sprinkled over pulp
- 1 C flour
- 1 ½ tsp baking powder
- 1 egg
- ½ C milk
- 1 tsp vanilla
- ½ C butter
- 1 C sifted powdered sugar
- 1 unbeaten egg white
- ½ tsp vanilla

For PUDDING, cream sugar and shortening; add persimmon pulp over which has been sprinkled the baking soda. Mix flour and baking powder together. Mix egg, milk and 1 tsp vanilla together. Add to persimmon mixture and beat together. Put in greased pudding bowl. Steam for 2 hours.

To make a HARD SAUCE, cream butter until soft. Gradually blend in powdered sugar. Beat in egg white and then stir in ½ tsp vanilla. Chill for one hour before serving with Persimmon Pudding.

RASPBERRY FLUFF

- 1 pkg frozen raspberries
- $\frac{3}{4}$ C sugar
- $\frac{1}{2}$ C water
- 3 Tbsp cornstarch
- 2 egg whites, beaten stiff
- whipped cream of Cool Whip for topping

Place raspberries, sugar and $\frac{1}{4}$ C water in pan. Bring to a boil. Mix cornstarch with $\frac{1}{4}$ C water and stir into raspberry mixture to thicken. Cook for a few minutes. Set aside to cool. Fold stiffly beaten egg whites and about 1 C of Cool Whip into the cooled raspberry mixture. Ladle into dessert dish and refrigerate until set. Garnish with Cool Whip just before serving.
