Bay Area teen picks church for Scout project

OROVILLE — A Bay Area teenager who frequently visits relatives in Oroville is currently working on a community project at Oroville First United Methodist Church for an Eagle Scout project.

Cameron Lewis, 17, of Castro Valley, is building sidewalks that lead to a preschool playground at the church and installing new metal benches.

The sidewalk area was dirt and gravel before the project.

One reason he's doing the project in Oroville is that the church is like home.

"This is the church I always come to," said Lewis as he worked on the project Friday.

"We're family."

Lewis is working toward becoming an Eagle Scout, which he said is the highest rank a Boy Scout can achieve up to the age of 18.

He got into the project when a representative of the church approached him, saying the church had obtained several metal benches, but there was no one to do the work.

Lewis was getting ready to start an Eagle Scout project at the time and had several possibilities lined up, so he agreed to help.

He's been preparing the project for about two months. Framing was done Thursday, with the help of about 20 people, Lewis said.

The teenager and his dad were back at the church Friday afternoon laying wire inside the sidewalk area.

Lewis, his dad and another crew of helpers will pour the cement today.

Materials were donated.

Lewis said his mom is from Oroville, and he has aunts, uncles and grandparents who still live in the area. He and his family visit Oroville often.

"We're here on weekends, and this church is where we go," he said.

Lewis said he only has to do one project to become an

Eagle Scout. It has to be for a community.

It's a lot of hard work and it also involves leadership skills, he said.

"Even though it's not my hometown, I'm still benefiting a

community I feel part of," he added. The benches, currently in

sections, will be linked together and stretch about 24 feet

long. Besides the

planning, Lewis said he's put in about 19 hours of work so far.

There isn't a set number of hours that has to go into the scout project.

"It just has to benefit a community," he said.

Lewis belongs to Boy Scout Troop 722 Castro Valley out of Faith Lutheran Church.

He's been scouting since the age of 5, when he was in the first grade.

Lewis indicated he's proud of the project.

"It's definitely for a good cause," he said. "It will be cool when it's done, and will definitely help the church. I feel good about it."

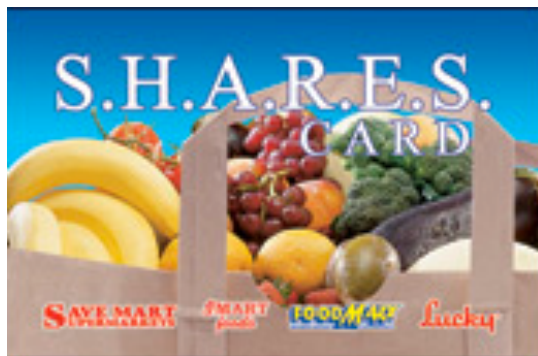

Outreach & Witness

At 17, Kathy Kyong Kim immigrated to America from Korea. "My mom would recite to me, "Trust in God, and everything will be OK,"" Kim recalled. She relied on that advice while devoting time to church and developing a strong relationship with God.

During the summer of her senior year of high school, Kim attended a church retreat that changed her life. "I made a solemn vow to God that I would do his work and be a missionary."

With the help of a World Communion scholarship, Kim is pursuing a master of divinity degree from the Claremont School of Theology with an emphasis on religious education. United Methodists celebrate [World Communion Sunday](#), one of six churchwide special Sundays, on the first Sunday in October.

Women and children, Kim asserted, bear a disproportionate share of the burden of poverty today and their numbers are increasing. "The role of the Christian in alleviating hunger and poverty is crucial," she said. "God has placed the responsibility for leadership on the Christian's shoulders."

Kim feels called to Christian mission, citing the statistic that two-thirds of the world's population has never heard the good news of God's love in Christ.

"I believe the good news has to make sense to them in their language and culture," she said. "I would like to be the one who shares with them the transforming love of Jesus Christ." Her vocational goal is to become an ordained pastor who goes to a developing country to aid women and children.

Work in her local church is preparing Kim for missionary service. She organizes and directs a vacation Bible school that serves 80 children annually. Kim also has led short-term mission trips to several countries, developing English and Bible school camps. In the local church, she has trained Sunday school teachers and other volunteers for children's ministries.

Gifts to the special offering equip racial and ethnic-minority students in the United States and international students to transform the church and communities. Contributions support:

World Communion Scholarships (General Board of Global Ministries), with at least one-half of the annual amount for ministries beyond the United States;

Ethnic In-Service Training Program (Higher Education and Ministry).

“As a disciple following the teachings of Wesley and Christ, I believe I have a responsibility to share the blessings God has bestowed upon me,” said Kim.

JOHN A. BROWN A memorial service for John Alton Brown, 79, of Oroville, Ca, will be held on Saturday, August 31, 2013, 1 p.m. at First United Methodist Church, 45 Acacia Avenue in Oroville. He passed away at his home in Oroville on August 12, 2013; John's passing is a loss to all who knew him. He was born and raised in Willits, Ca. His parents were Willard and Ellen Brown. He was married to his high school sweetheart, Margaret Brown, for 58 years and raised five children. After his graduation from Willits High School in 1953 he attended the College of Redwoods and Butte College. He was employed by North Western Pacific Railroad and Solano Railcar

Company. He was a Millwright at multiple California Power Plant Projects, and worked as an Independent Contractor. He was an active member of the First United Methodist Church and the Masonic Blue Lodge of Oroville, Ca. He was a member of the Brotherhood of Railway Carmen and the Boilermaker and Blacksmith Union. He was the President of the Oroville Breakfast Lions, Ophir Gopher Jeep Club, and the Redwood Empire Four Wheel Drive Club. He contributed to his community as the Parade Chairmen of the Willits Annual Frontier Days Celebration, a rodeo clown and a roller- skating clown. He was a Dad Advisor for the Order of DeMolay, Order of Rainbow for Girls and a leader of the Campfire Girls and Boy Scouts of Butte and Humboldt Counties. In the 1980's John had the good fortune to meet Gerald Lugenbeel, Jr., a quadriplegic sculptor from Mexico who was residing in Chico, Ca. Gerald became John's mentor, training him in the lost wax method of casting. Their friendship continued for many years. John went on to become a sculptor in his own right. His piece "Hear our voices" was displayed at the Arc Solano, an art program for people with developmental disabilities. His piece "The Dreamer" is currently on display at the Fort Bragg Public Library. He shared his love of art with many children as a volunteer art teacher for Helen Wilcox School, Feather Falls School, Sierra Avenue School and Manzanita School. He is survived by his beloved wife, Margaret Brown, five children, Nancy (Albert) Brown-Camacho, Mike (Rosetta) Brown, Rachel (William) Ford, Gail (Troy) Leonard, Alex (Angela) Brown, thirteen grandchildren and four great grandchildren. He was a devoted husband, father and friend. His example taught us to work hard, give what you can, be creative and take care of those who can't take care of themselves. He was always ready with a story, a car ride or a grapefruit. He was an excellent storyteller and will be missed dearly.
