Off the record: Words of grace and wisdom, from Maya Angelou

The first time I was in her presence was at Mills College in 1981. I was one among an intimate group of 99 other college women anxious to hear her speak. She was the same age I am now but her energy matched that of her young audience.

Her voice was strong and clear. She was a commanding presence both in stature; she was 6 feet tall, and in voice. Once she began to speak no one spoke, whispered or coughed. I'm not even sure any of us moved a muscle for the next two hours.

I fell in love that day, with her, with her thoughts and with the fierce grace she commanded language. It wasn't difficult or even unexpected, I had read everything she had written and was an ardent student of her work. I was also one of a dozen students who had been accepted into her week-long writers workshop.

I have never worked so hard writing in my life.

"I've done my best work with you," I told her at the end. "I may never write better than I did this week."

"You will," she said looking directly into my eyes. "You will," she repeated with such certainty that I became a believer.

Then, Maya Angelou took my face in both her hands, kissed me on the forehead and I was dismissed.

The second time I was in her presence was just a few years ago. Again I sat in a college auditorium and this time the college woman sitting next to me was my daughter. She too fell in love with the indomitable spirit of Angelou who that evening made us think, made us cry and made us laugh. She spoke of ideas, she told stories and she sang a verse of a spiritual: "When it looked like it wouldn't stop raining, God put a rainbow in the clouds."

On Wednesday the spirit of this gifted women — poet, author, director, playwright, composer, singer, dancer and, yes, former brothel madam and the first female and first black San Francisco streetcar conductor — moved on. She had lived among us for 86 years and, I grieved at her passing not because she left us but rather because she graced us. We are left a little less without her grace. We are left better for having a rich legacy of her work to inspire us. It is our turn in her honor to carry the light of grace forward.

From Maya through me to you, some words of grace and wisdom: "I believe that each of us comes from the creator trailing wisps of glory."

"I've learned that people will forget what you said, people will forget what you did, but people will never forget how you made them feel." "You are the sum total of everything you've ever seen, heard, eaten, smelled, been told, forgot — it's all there. Everything influences each of us, and because of that I try to make sure that my experiences are positive."

"Love recognizes no barriers. It jumps hurdles, leaps fences, penetrates walls to arrive at its destination full of hope."

"Nothing can dim the light which shines from within."

"While I know myself as a creation of God, I am also obligated to realize and remember that everyone else and everything else are also God's creation."

"Prejudice is a burden that confuses the past, threatens the future and renders the present inaccessible."


"There's a world of difference between truth and facts. Facts can obscure the truth."

"I have found that among its other benefits, giving liberates the soul of the giver."

"Love is like a virus. It can happen to anybody at any time".

And my favorite words of wisdom: "If you don't like something, change it. If you can't change it, change your attitude."

Amen!

Pastor Dave has met with a number of people when they come to the church needing food. If anyone approaches you when you are at the church asking about food, unless you feel it's an emergency & have time to help them, the normal distribution days & hours are when office is open.

People often ask me what is needed in the pantry. This changes often but here are the items which are most often needed. We can always use peanut butter & meat or fish (canned chicken, tuna, spam etc). Other items are: canned soup, pasta, chili etc. Please remember the food pantry is for non perishable items & the food needs to be commercially prepared (not home made) and not out of date.
