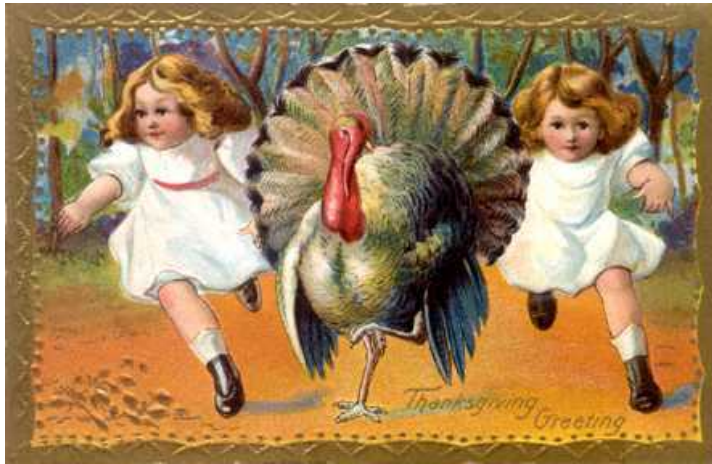

***YANKEE BERRY STEAK***  
***Doris Henneker from Marlys***

1 slice (2 lb) round steak	3 Tbsp flour
1 tsp salt	¼ C water
pepper	¼ C lemon juice
½ tsp Worcestershire sauce	1 can whole-berry cranberry sauce
½ C celery	1 clove garlic or garlic salt
1 Tbsp sugar	hot rice (buttered)

Rub steak (both sides) with flour mixed with salt and pepper and brown in salad oil. Combine water, lemon juice and Worcestershire sauce and pour over steak. Simmer 1 hour, covered.

Mix cranberry sauce, celery, garlic, sugar and spoon on top of steak. Simmer another hour, covered. Remove to platter without disturbing topping, and spoon buttered rice around edge. The sauce left in pan can be used as a gravy for rice.

***APPLE BUTTER BREAD PUDDING***  
***Joline Hibbert***

6 slices firm bread	¾ C apple butter
2 Tbsp melted butter	2 C milk
4 eggs	1/3 C sugar
2 tsp vanilla	½ tsp cinnamon

Spread apple butter on three slices of bread and top with other three slices. Butter a 1 ½ quart casserole. Cut the three sandwiches into nine pieces and place in the casserole. Drizzle the rest of the butter over the bread. Whisk together the milk, eggs, sugar, vanilla, and cinnamon. Pour over bread. Press down. Let stand 1/2 hour. Set casserole in a pan of hot water and bake at 350 degrees about 45 minutes or until a knife comes out clean when inserted in the pudding. Let cool.

Serve with a warm apple juice sauce (apple juice thickened with corn starch, a little sugar and some lemon juice. Also nice served with half and half or whipped cream.

### GOOD NEWS ON RALEY'S AND FOOD MAXX SHARE CARDS

I have a new report on our church share cards as a fundraiser for our church. In August we received a check from Food Maxx for \$145.38. We receive a new check about every three months. In July we received a check from Raley's for \$79.05. We receive a check from Raley's about every three months as well. For the year to date we have received \$493.47 from Food Maxx and \$228.00 from Raley's. Put the two cards together and we have made \$721.47 for our church budget. .

Just swipe your card when you pay for your groceries. A portion of what you spend for your groceries comes back to our church. If you don't have a Raley's Something Extra Card just ask for a card while you are shopping in Raley's. Raley's does require that you designate how much you want to come back to your church. You are required to do this on line on your own computer. If you don't have a computer or if you are having trouble setting this up see Elaine Klein. If you don't have a Food Maxx Share Card see Ginger Ewalt.

Keep using the cards and help our church budget.

She graduated high school in the little town of Nehawka at age 16, class of 1941. Virginia's parents didn't have money for her to go to college but in her senior year, she won the National Canning Champion Scholarship from Ball canning jars. She graduated University Nebraska in 1945, at age 20 with a Bachelor of

Science and was a member of Phi Upsilon Omicron. Virginia did her dietetic internship in Chicago, IL, and received her Registered Dietitian license in 1946. Virginia met Emery Field, her husband of 63 years, at Livermore Veterans Hospital in 1946 where Virginia worked as a Dietitian and Emery worked as the cook. Virginia was Emery's boss and continued to be his boss for the next 63 years. Virginia and Emery lived in Oroville, California for over 57 years where they raised their 4 children Arlene, Margaret, Jeannie, and Mark. Virginia went back to work in 1959. She worked as a social worker for Butte County for 25 years. Virginia continued to stay busy. She was active in the Oroville UMC for over 55 years. Virginia loved to travel and had been to Japan, Alaska, Europe, New Zealand, and the Holy Land, and she was baptized in the River Jordan. She was preceded in death by her parents Hall and Verna Pollard, sister Carol Ann Pollard, sister Margie Newman, daughter Margaret Field-Richter, and husband Emery Field. She is survived by her brother James Pollard, by two daughters and son-in-laws, Arlene and Bill Hedge of Palmer, Alaska and Jeannie and Chet Long of Janesville, California; a son and daughter-in-law Mark and Kyoko Field of Hakone, Japan; eight grandchildren and nine great-grandchildren. 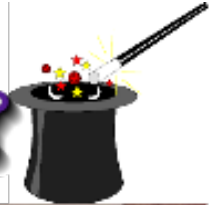

- **Vegetable Juice (16 oz and under only)...** *for example:* V8 100% Vegetable Juice, Odwalla Carrot Juice, Campbell's Tomato Juice
- **"Sport" drinks...** *for example:* Powerade, Gatorade
