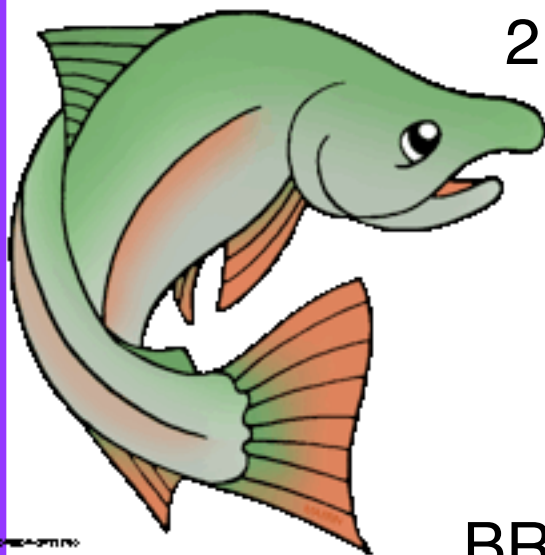

## ***THE FLOATING CHURCH***



**Origins:** This anecdote of 19th century Methodists in North Carolina who were rebuffed in their efforts to purchase a particular piece of land for a new church building, only to see the church they instead built on an alternate site lifted by a hurricane and deposited onto the very plot they had attempted to buy, is true in the main although the denouement has been spiced up a bit in the above-quoted example to reflect the religious awe theme of the tale.

As chronicled on the Economic Development Partnership of North Carolina's [web site](#), "The Church Moved by the Hand of God" story involved what is now known as Providence United Methodist Church and took place in September 1876:

Since the late 19th century, Providence United Methodist Church has been known as "The Church Moved by the Hand of God." Although in the ensuing years the story of this 'miracle' seems to have gotten the actual facts a little mixed up, no one can deny that the simple frame building at the rear of the present brick church seemed to be destined by fate. Somewhat frustrated when their efforts to obtain their chosen site on which to build a church were rebuffed by the land owner, Samuel R. Sadler, the group built on another lot in the village. On September 16, 1876, as their new church was being dedicated, a hurricane hit the village. Reportedly, heavy rains and wind tide pushed in from the Pamlico Sound and flooded the town, until the village and surrounding area were under five feet of water. The winds were strong and relentless, and the new church building was floated off its brick pilings and began the journey which gives the story credence. The church traveled north and then east, eventually reaching the exact piece of property the congregation had earlier attempted to purchase. After turning itself around facing Main Street, the church settled onto this higher piece of ground and remained there. Title to the land was eventually obtained in 1881.

This is from a 1930 cook book. You can use pack of fresh mushrooms and sliced them for this recipe and sauté them in 5 to 6 tbs butter to take care of the fat.

### SCALLOPED RICE AND MUSHROOMS

2 cupfuls hot, seasoned, cooked rice	1 four-ounce can mushrooms
1 can condensed tomato soup	4 tablespoonfuls melted fat
1 seeded green pepper	Salt
	Pepper

Combine the rice, tomato soup, green pepper chopped fine, canned mushrooms with juice, fat and additional salt and pepper if necessary. Arrange in a greased casserole and bake in a moderate oven of 375° F. for 30 min. Serves 6.



### GARDEN CASSEROLE

2 C. broccoli spears	generous sprinkling of pepper
2 zucchini or yellow squash, cut into 1-inch rounds	
1/2 C low-fat cottage cheese	1/2 C Feta cheese
1 onion, sliced	2-4 Fresh tomatoes

Preheat oven to 350°. Arrange raw vegetables in large, oiled casserole baking pan. Season with pepper. Mix together the cheeses and spoon them over vegetables. Cover and bake 45 minutes, until vegetables are cooked, but not mushy.

Variations: Use mushrooms, cauliflower, green beans or any other seasonal plentiful vegetable.

### GOOD NEWS ON RALEY'S AND FOOD MAXX SHARE CARDS

I have a new report on our church share cards as a fundraiser for our church. In August we received a check from Food Maxx for \$145.38. We receive a new check about every three months. In September we received a check from Raley's for \$79.05. We receive a check from Raley's about every three months as well. For the year to date we have received \$493.47 from Food Maxx and \$228.00 from Raley's. Put the two cards together and we have made \$721.47 for our church budget. .

Just swipe your card when you pay for your groceries. A portion of what you spend for your groceries comes back to our church. If you don't have a Raley's Something Extra Card just ask for a card while you are shopping in Raley's. Raley's does require that you designate how much you want to come back to your church. You are required to do this on line on your own computer. If you don't have a computer or if you are having trouble setting this up see Elaine Kline. If you don't have a Food Maxx Share Card see Ginger Ewalt.

Keep using the cards and help our church budget.

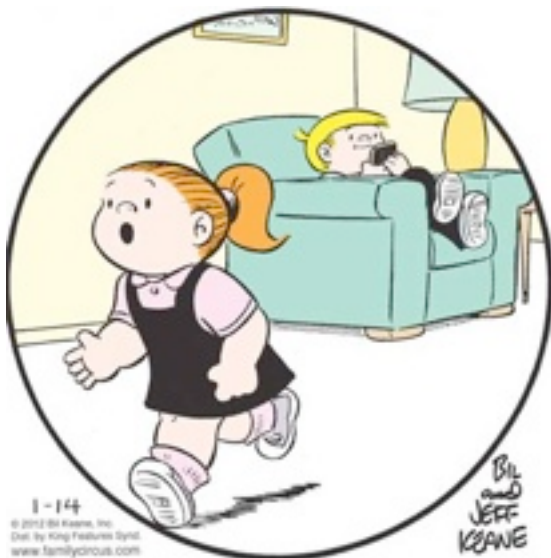
