FOOD PANTRY REPORT



Our church's Food Pantry is providing emergency food to residents in the neighborhood 4 days a week, Monday – Thursday from 9:00 AM – Noon.

This report is the first of a continuing schedule of monthly reports to let the congregation know how many households we serve and how many people we serve each month out of our Food Pantry. This first report will cover the 3-month period, January thru March, 2016.

Note: Households are limited to 2 visits per month.

As you know, our Food Pantry is supported solely by donations from the membership and occasional fundraisers. Food donations are welcome, but donations of cash or check are the preferred types of donations. That way food items can be purchased as needed, when needed. Cash or check donations can be made to the church with a designation for Food Pantry. That way the donor will have the donation amount itemized on their annual giving statement from the church.

Presently, the pantry is full, but the balance in the Food Pantry bank account is less than \$200, so cash or check **DONATIONS ARE NEEDED NOW** to provide funds for continued purchases. (Continued on back of page).

CHICKEN DIVAN

Alma Short

4 C	cooked chicken or turkey	2 pkg	frozen broccoli or fresh
3/4 lb	cheddar cheese, grated	3/4 to 1 C	buttered bread crumbs
1/2 cube	butter or margarine	2 cans	cream of chicken soup
1/2 C	mayonnaise	2/3 tsp	curry powder
1 Tbsp	lemon juice		

Into a 13" x 9" x 2" baking dish, layer the chicken, broccoli and cheese. Make SAUCE by mixing soup, mayonnaise, curry powder and lemon juice; pour evenly onto cheese. Sprinkle breadcrumbs over all. Pour melted margarine over breadcrumbs.

Bake at 350° for 30 to 40 minutes or until it bubbles..

Place raspberries, sugar and 1/4 C water in pan. Bring to a boil. Mix cornstarch with 1/4 C water and stir into raspberry mixture to thicken. Cook for a few minutes. Set aside to cool. Fold stiffly beaten egg whites and about 1 C of Cool Whip into the cooled raspberry mixture. Ladle into dessert dish and refrigerate until set. Garnish with Cool Whip just before serving.

Our Food Maxx Shares Program has made **\$238.92** so far this year as a fundraiser for our church budget. We no longer can use the shares card. Just put in the church phone number 5305349455 in the keypad and touch the green button when you pay for your groceries. The Raley's Something Extra Card has made **\$77.59** so far this year for our church budget. We still have a card at Raley's. If you don't have a Raley's card ask for a card the next time you shop at Raley's. You are required to designate how much you want to come back to the church when we use our Raley's card. You can do this from your own computer. If you don't have a computer or if you are having trouble setting this up ask Jeremy Buis to help you. We get money from Food Maxx and Raley's every three months. The UMC Market has made \$23.10 so far this year for our church budget. The UMC Market is when you purchase things on the internet. Such as Amazon and many other internet shopping stores. You can read about the UMC Market in The Feather each month.

Remember Food Maxx, Raley's and UMC Market when you shop. Put all three together and we have made **\$339.61** so far this year for our church budget. What an easy way to help our church budget.

If you want to use your own telephone number you must log in on your own computer at www.escrip.com. Then sign up to use your own phone number. You must have an e-mail to do this. If you don't have an e-mail to make it easier for you Jeremy Buis has set up the church phone number for all of us to use. Just put in the church phone number in the keypad 5305349455 and hit the green button. That is all you have to do. I tried it and it works. I tried signing up but I had problems so I just use the church phone number. This is a great fundraiser for our church budget. We make about \$300.00 every three months for our church.
