## Pop Tab Program

The Pop Tab Program began when a community in Minneapolis collected one million pop tabs to recycle as a fundraiser and the trend has since spread to hundreds of Ronald McDonald Houses across the country. A pop tab is the small metal tab on the top of aluminum beverage cans. The **Sacramento Ronald McDonald House** collects these pop tabs to recycle and put the proceeds towards the Adopt-A-Family Program. This program helps subsidize the cost of families staying at the Sacramento Ronald McDonald House. The House receives thousands of pop tabs each year collected by families, church groups, service clubs, auxiliaries, and student organizations. Saving pop tabs from aluminum cans is an easy and environmentally-friendly way of supporting the Sacramento Ronald McDonald House.

**When Micah receives the recycling he removes the tabs and gives them to Hayden Wyman's family to take to the Ronald McDonald House in Sacramento. Hayden's grandparents are Derrald's neighbors.**

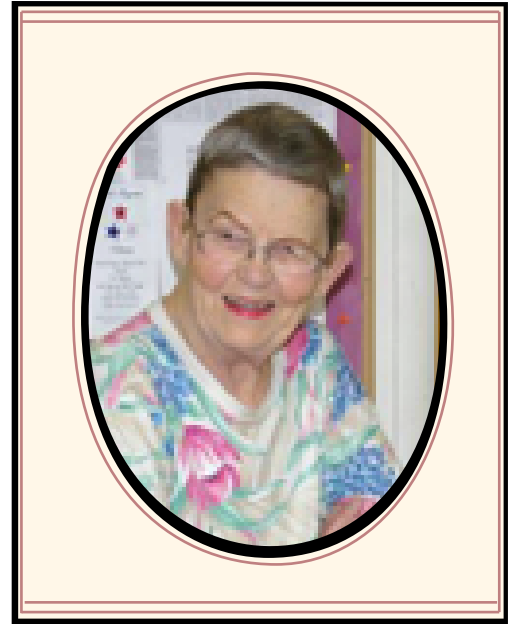

## FIRST UNITED METHODIST CHURCH OF OROVILLE

**William Lee “Bill” Short**, 76 years old, passed away on June 23, 2016, after a brief illness. Bill was born in Los Angeles, CA, the only child of Claude Short and Virginia White. He graduated from Cal Northern School of Law, Chico, CA, attaining a Juris Doctorate (Cum Laude) in 1987. He also passed the California State Bar, that same year.

Bill had an incredible work history. He started in the late 1950's as a radio disc jockey while writing articles and taking pictures for the LA Times. In the early 1960s, he moved to the Island of Kauai, where he was part of a group that built the radio station KAUI. He was a great storyteller and always had a fascinating tale to tell about his time in Kauai and the many adventures in his news reporting and law careers. During the next 20 years, Bill moved to Northern California and worked for the California Department of Justice, and also as a Stanislaus County Deputy Sheriff and Sheriff's Pilot. During the 1960's, Bill attended the McGeorge School of Law. He later transitioned to a career as an investigative reporter and photographer for the Oroville Mercury Register and Redding Record Searchlight. While in Redding, in the 1970's, he was the television anchorman for Channel 7. He later completed his studies at Cal Northern School of Law as a member of the first graduating class of 1987. Bill then became a Butte County Public Defender until his retirement in 2014. In 2015, he was sworn in as a Judge Pro Tem. He was excited to be on the other side of the bench.



In recent years, Bill's passion was Oroville Sunrise Rotary Club. He spearheaded efforts to bring together the Monday Club and both Oroville Rotary clubs as co-owners of the Historic Monday Club building. He was also instrumental in starting an Interact Club at Oroville High School, which has grown to be a driving force for community service. In 2013-2014 Bill was Governor of Rotary District 5180. Bill was always ready for a glass of good wine and a fine cigar. He loved Apple computer products, fishing in Alaska and family trips to Ashland and Mendocino.

Bill is survived by his wife of 22 years, Alma, and his children, Hailey, Jim (Virginia), Cheri, Lara, and step-children Robynn (Greg), Timothy, and 11 grandchildren.

2 tsp cinnamon

3 C sugar  
1/4 C vinegar  
1 lb raisins

SHARE CARDS**

**During May 2016** we received a check for our Food Maxx Share Cards for \$196.05. Our Food Maxx Program has made \$434.97 year to date so far this year as a fundraiser for our church budget. We receive a check about once every three months We no longer can use the shares card. Just put in the church phone number(530)534-9455 in the keypad and touch the green button when you pay for your groceries. The Raley's Something Extra Card has made \$151.13 so far this year for our church budget. We receive a check about once every three months for the Raley's card. We received a check from Raley's just last month. We still have a card at Raley's. If you don't have a Raley's card ask for a card the next time you shop at Raley's. You are required to designate how much you want to come back to the church when we use our Raley's card. You can do this from your own computer. If you don't have a computer or if you are having trouble setting this up ask Jeremy Buis to help you. We get money from Food Maxx and Raley's every three months. The UMC Market has made \$23.10 so far this year for our church budget. The UMC Market is when you purchase things on the internet. Many stores participate. See the article of what stores in the feather.. You can read about the UMC Market in The Feather each month. Remember Food Maxx, Raley's and UMC Market when you shop. Put all three together and we have made \$609.20 so far this year for our church budget. What an easy to help our church budget.

You must have an e-mail to do this. If you don't have an e-mail to make it easier for you Jeremy Buis has set up the church phone number for all of us to use. Just put in the church phone number in the keypad 5305349455 and hit the green button. That is all you have to do. I tried it and it works. I tried signing up but I had problems so I just use the church phone number. This is a great fundraiser for our church budget. We make about \$300.00 every three months for our church.

- **Noncarbonated Soft Drink...** *for example:* SoBe Lifewater, Country Time Lemonade, Glaceau Vitaminwater, Visvita Aloe Vera Drink, Don Jose Horchata.
- **Vegetable Juice (16 oz and under only)...** *for example:* V8 100% Vegetable Juice, Odwalla Carrot Juice, Campbell's Tomato Juice
- **"Sport" drinks...** *for example:* Powerade, Gatorade
